Ibn 'Umar (may Allah be pleased with him) reported that the Messenger of Allah (may Allah's peace and blessings be upon him) combined the Maghrib and Ishā' prayers. He prayed three Rak'ahs for Maghrib then two Rak'ahs for Ishā' with one Iqamah.

[Authentic hadith] [Narrated by Muslim]

The Hadīth shows the way the Prophet (may Allah's peace and blessings be upon him) combined between the prayers one night when he was at Al-Muzdalifah after his return from 'Arafah. He combined Maghrib prayer with Ishā' prayer and shortened the latter to two Rak'ahs only with one Adhān for both and one Iqamah for each.
